

WHAT TO BRING TO YOUR ESTATE APPOINTMENT

1. **PERSONAL INFORMATION ABOUT YOU** including:

The Executor or Administrator must provide 2 pieces of ID (1 government issued photo ID [Drivers Licence, Passport, etc.] and one other piece)

Full legal name Address, telephone numbers and e-mail address Occupation Social Insurance Number

2. **INFORMATION ABOUT THE DECEASED** that you may be aware of:

Full legal name (including any aliases) Address at date of death Date and place of birth Date and place of death Occupation or former occupation Maiden name (if applicable) Social Insurance Number Marital Status Name of spouse (if applicable) (if spouse is deceased, date of death) Names, addresses and dates of birth of children (if a child is deceased, date of death and names, addresses and dates of birth of his or her children)

3. INFORMATION ABOUT THE BENEFICIARIES

Full legal names, addresses and dates of birth of beneficiaries (if a beneficiary is deceased, date of death and names, addresses and dates of birth of his or her children) If beneficiary is a minor the name and address of the parent / legal guardian

3. DOCUMENTS

Original Death Certificate Original Will (if one exists or a copy of the Will Any other documents you think are relevant to the estate Uncashed cheques / cash on hand or in Deceased's wallet

4. **SUMMARY OF ESTATE ASSETS** (the lawyer will ask questions about estate assets):

Real estate - copies of property assessments Bank accounts - copies of statements Investment accounts (including RRSP, RRIF, TFSA) - copies of statements Pension accounts Life Insurance Vehicles – copies of registration papers for motor vehicles or boats CPP and OAS monthly payment benefits (if applicable). Is the Deceased entitled to unpaid wages? If so, name and address of employer will be required. Outstanding loans payable to the Deceased

5. **SUMMARY OF ESTATE LIABILITIES** (the lawyer will ask questions about estate liabilities such as mortgages, personal loans, lines of credit, personal guarantees, etc.):

8. OTHER THINGS TO CONSIDER:

Do you have an accountant to assist you in the preparation and filings of the Deceased's tax returns and any estate tax returned that may be necessary? If so, the name and address of that accountant.
